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Concealed Tiebacks - Benefits



Before



Notice the inconsistent pleat size, depth variations, and perimeter of the outside drapery edge

After



The concealed tieback holder positions gives the outside drapery perimeter a tailored edge that clients expect from a designer treatment and helps to keep the pleats uniform and consistent.

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Concealed Tiebacks – How to Use



- » Mount the product to the wall where the outside drapery perimeter flows
- » Adjust the depth slide accordingly to match the depth of the drapery pleat



- » Secure the tieback around the notches located on the top and bottom of the concealer



- » Place the outer edge drapery pleat over the tieback holder to conceal the product

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Concealed Tiebacks – Additional Details



- » Kirsch offers two concealed tiebacks:
 - 7652.058 – for 5”-8” (adjustable) return
 - 7623B.058 – 3.5” return
- » Tiebacks can also be ordered in bulk with part numbers 7652R.058 and 7623R.058.
- » Kirsch recommends that designers and installers stock the concealed tieback holder to use with all drapery tieback installations.
- » Tieback Tip: To prevent ‘bunching’, make sure the tieback is long enough. A general recommendation is for the tieback to be 1/3 of the total panel width.



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
